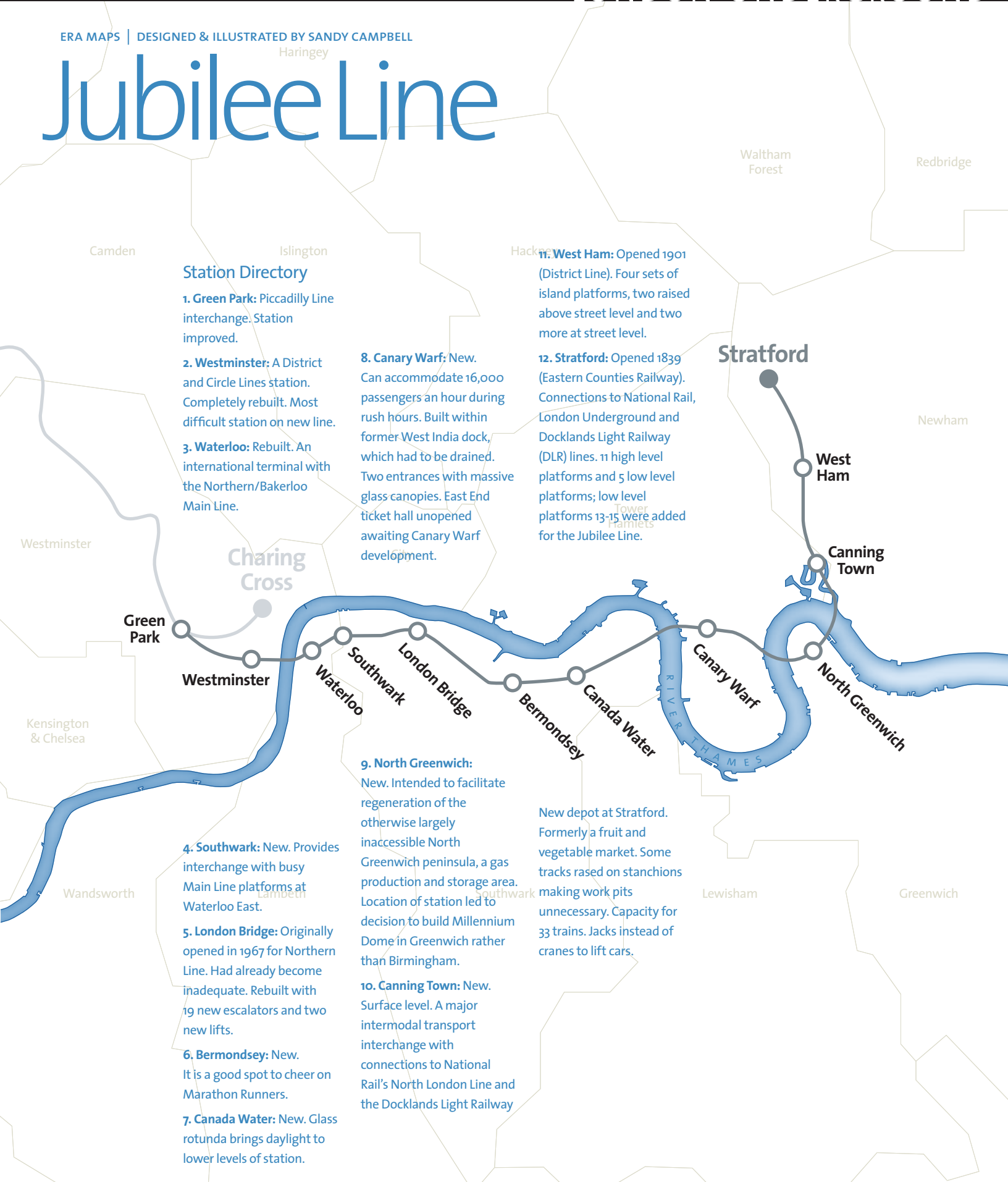

Jubilee Line



Station Directory

- 1. **Green Park:** Piccadilly Line interchange. Station improved.
- 2. **Westminster:** A District and Circle Lines station. Completely rebuilt. Most difficult station on new line.
- 3. **Waterloo:** Rebuilt. An international terminal with the Northern/Bakerloo Main Line.

- 8. **Canary Warf:** New. Can accommodate 16,000 passengers an hour during rush hours. Built within former West India dock, which had to be drained. Two entrances with massive glass canopies. East End ticket hall unopened awaiting Canary Warf development.

- 11. **West Ham:** Opened 1901 (District Line). Four sets of island platforms, two raised above street level and two more at street level.

- 12. **Stratford:** Opened 1839 (Eastern Counties Railway). Connections to National Rail, London Underground and Docklands Light Railway (DLR) lines. 11 high level platforms and 5 low level platforms; low level platforms 13-15 were added for the Jubilee Line.

- 4. **Southwark:** New. Provides interchange with busy Main Line platforms at Waterloo East.

- 5. **London Bridge:** Originally opened in 1967 for Northern Line. Had already become inadequate. Rebuilt with 19 new escalators and two new lifts.

- 6. **Bermondsey:** New. It is a good spot to cheer on Marathon Runners.

- 7. **Canada Water:** New. Glass rotunda brings daylight to lower levels of station.

- 9. **North Greenwich:** New. Intended to facilitate regeneration of the otherwise largely inaccessible North Greenwich peninsula, a gas production and storage area. Location of station led to decision to build Millennium Dome in Greenwich rather than Birmingham.

- 10. **Canning Town:** New. Surface level. A major intermodal transport interchange with connections to National Rail's North London Line and the Docklands Light Railway

New depot at Stratford. Formerly a fruit and vegetable market. Some tracks rased on stanchions making work pits unnecessary. Capacity for 33 trains. Jacks instead of cranes to lift cars.
