- Charlotte light rail system with historic streetcar operation

Other New York Metro area news update scenes will be shown including Second Avenue Subway construction, Staten Island Railway diesels at new homes, and much more local transit. The presentation will end with a snowy ride on the White Pass & Yukon Railroad to help keep cool during the hot summer days! Those who have attended Andrew's shows know this is not to be missed!
